

# Cockfosters Station Car Park charges and payment, and travel into London

**November 2017**

(Subject to variation without notice at any time)

**Cockfosters Station** offers great value for a day's parking and easy access to central London on the Piccadilly Line. Turn left after the BP petrol station, and before the tube station itself.

Drive in, park up, and walk towards the tube station where you will see these machines on the left.

Pay at these machines by cash or card.

No need to go back to the car again, as there is an automatic car registration recognition system.



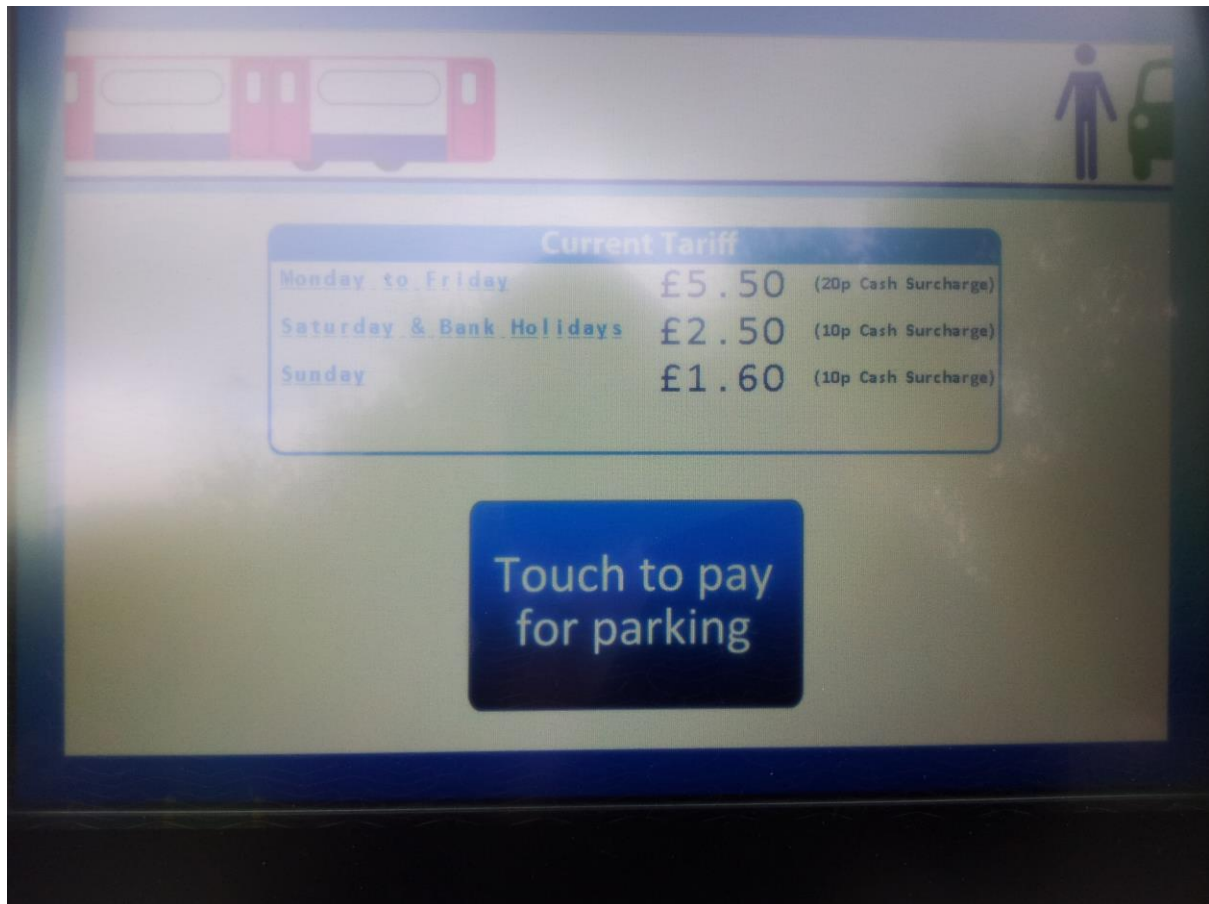
**2017 Car park costs** as follows:

**Cash**

£5.70 Midweek / £2.60 Saturday and Bank Holidays / £1.60 Sundays

**Card**

£5.50 Midweek / £2.50 Saturday and Bank Holidays / £1.60 Sundays

**Taxis**

Don't forget the alternative of a cab to and from the tube station which saves the hassle. It is £5 each way. From the hotel we can call a cab for you and it comes really quickly. From the station the cab office is open in the ticket hall all day and until the last tube.

## Tube

If you can, aim to travel after 9.30am midweek, or anytime at weekends or bank holidays.

The best card to use is your contactless bank card if you have one. Alternatively an Oyster Card if you have this set up. Both have the same discounted fares, and you just touch your card on the yellow circular reader at each tube barrier you come to.

Cockfosters is in Zone 5 of the London Underground.

What is Anytime?

Anytime can be used at any time during the day from which your ticket is valid. It is valid up until 04:30 the next day.

What is Off-Peak?

Off-Peak tickets can only be used from 09:30 Monday to Fridays, and all day on Saturdays, Sundays and public holidays. It is valid up until 04:30 the next day.

What is Contactless?

Contactless is the use of an Oyster card or a bank card which supports contactless payments.

What is a Daily Cap?

A daily cap is the maximum you will pay a day if using contactless. This is the equivalent to a cash Travelcard ensures you never pay more than necessary.

The **Piccadilly Line** is the best line for all the Central London attractions, from Holborn for the British Museum, Covent Garden for all the entertainment and shopping, Leicester Square for cinemas and the National Gallery and Trafalgar Square, Piccadilly Circus for Regent St shopping, Green Park and Hyde Park Corner for Buckingham Palace, Knightsbridge for Harrods, and South Kensington for the Science museum, V&A museum and Natural History museum.

## **Night tube**

A new innovation this year is the night tube service on the Piccadilly Line with all night running to and from Cockfosters on Friday and Saturday nights. The taxi office at Cockfosters is open all night on these nights too.

The Night Tube runs on Fridays and Saturdays on the Victoria, Jubilee, and most of the Central, Northern and Piccadilly lines.
