The flavours in Australian wines were a revelation to many: buttery, full, new oaked Chardonnay with no hint of austerity; rich, blackcurranty reds, brimming with fruit and with no sign of mouth-puckering tannins.

The Bordeaux region is arguably the finest area for red wines in the world. Famed for their wonderful complexity of aromas and flavours, great elegance and refinement and an ability to age gracefully - some for a hundred years. Bordeaux, known for being divided by the river Gironde, produces predominantly Cabernet Sauvignon in Graves and Médoc on the west side of the river and Merlot from St Émilion and Pomerol on the east of the river.
