The Catalpa bignonioides collection is maturing nicely, we plan to apply for National Collection status in a few years' time, but for now you can enjoy a wide selection of these **Indian Bean Trees**, with their large leaves and summer flowers.

The extraordinary **Pawlonia tomentosa 'Fast Blue'** (**Foxglove tree**) was only planted in 2008 but is already 40' high!







The beautiful **Magnolia grandiflora 'Exmouth'** is at its best in the summer months with a lovely citrus scent from the late flowers that carry on until the first frosts of autumn.

The Pterocarya fraxinifolia (Caucasian wingnut tree) is one of our most exotic specimens, and at this time of year the "catkins" are about 18" long. If you fancy seeing this remarkable tree in the wild, book your summer holiday to Chechnya or Dagestan!





The Cotinus coggygria (Smokebush) is also at its best in the summer months, with the influorescenses giving the effect of

the whole tree being on fire!

In a year when many of our coniferous species have not done well for cones, Abies koreana is

the exception with a profusion of these stunning blue and yellow resinous cones.

Another good tree this summer for cones is our stunning **Cedrus** atlantica (Atlantic cedar) which dominates the restaurant end of the arboretum.



Like bunches of grapes hanging down, this **Prunus** laurocerasus rare Camelliifolia (or laurel) has a profusion of fruit and makes a spectacular summer display



Dates in the diary include Arboretum tours on Wednesday 3rd September, Thursday 18th September, Tuesday 30th September, Wednesday 15th October, Thursday 30th October.

Just book a two course lunch or an afternoon tea, and get me free of charge for a one and a half hour tour!

The National Gardens Scheme Open Day is on Sunday 26th October 1-4pm, just £4 entry for adults and free for children. The Beale Arboretum is spectacular at this time of year, with Taxodiums (Swamp Cypress), Quercus (Oak), Acers (Maple) being particularly impressive in their autumnal colours.
