Using Step Free Access at Hadley Wood Station

How can Step Free Access help me?

- Hadley Wood Station has a step free street-to-platform exit/entrance to its northbound platform (Platform 4), clearly signposted from the station forecourt.
- Step free access makes using the station easier for anyone with mobility issues
 or hidden disabilities, or for those who are travelling with buggies or heavy
 luggage.
- Anyone arriving from London can use it to exit the station.
- Anyone travelling towards Welwyn Garden City can use it to enter the station.

How can I travel step free towards London?

- To travel south towards London Kings Cross, do the following:
 - Take a northbound train towards Welwyn Garden City from Platform 4 to next station (four minutes' journey)
 - Alight at Potters Bar station (also step free street-to-platform)
 - · Board the next (fast) southbound train to London Kings Cross
- You (and your travel companions) can do this without paying any additional fare, providing you don't exit at Potters Bar.
- A special Circulatory Route Timetable is posted on the noticeboard on Platform 4; can be picked up from the station ticket office; or downloaded from www.hadleywood.org.uk/step-free-travel. Why not carry a copy with you to show that the circulatory route is authorised?

How do I get Step Free Access from Platform to Train?

- Wheelchair and Mobility Scooter Users, and any other passengers who need
 assistance between train and platform (including those arriving from the north on
 Platform I), should contact GTR's Assisted Travel:

 - Textphone 0800 138 1018
- GTR's Assisted Travel line is available every day, 07:00 to 22:00, except Christmas Day.

Will a Wheelchair or Mobility Scooter Fit on the Train?

You can bring a manual or electric wheelchair or a mobility scooter on to any of the trains, subject to the following size and weight limits for safety reasons.

- ♦ width: 70 cm
- length, including footplates: 1.2 metres
- weight, including your weight: 300 kg (or just over 47 stone)

Where can I park?

- On arrival, users will see one designated parking space for blue badge holders outside Hadley Wood Dental Practice adjacent to the station.
- You can pick up or drop off anyone needing step free facilities down the cul-desac leading from the forecourt to the step free entrance but unattended parking is not permitted there.
- There is no dedicated station parking at Hadley Wood.

Where can I Buy a Ticket or Top Up my Oyster Card?

- You can buy train tickets from the ticket office (open Monday to Friday 06:30 to 10:00) or from ticket machines on the station forecourt. Both are at street level.
- Oyster cards can be topped up using the ticket machines or at Londis in the parade of shops adjacent to the station.
