## House Rules for Dogs & Dog Owners

- We welcome well behaved dogs and their well-behaved owners in selected bedrooms at West Lodge Park - in the Garden Lodge spacious bedrooms 80 and 88, and in Cedar Lodge family bedroom 70 and cosy double bedroom 71:
  - Bedroom 80 is a large classic room, offering ideal access to the hotel's surrounding grounds.
  - Bedroom 88 has its own private terrace outside and a gate leading to the exterior of the hotel, and the hotel car park.
  - Bedrooms 70 and 71 have direct access to the hotel's gardens.
- Dogs remain the responsibility of the owner at all times.
- Bedding, food, water bowls etc., remain the responsibility of the owner at all times and should be brought with you.
- No dogs of non-residents are permitted, except guide dogs.
- Dogs are not allowed in the Mary Beale Restaurant in the main house of West Lodge Park [except guide dogs], but well-behaved dogs of residents are permitted to sit with their owners in the Terrace Bar, and the outside bar terrace area.
- Dogs must be supervised at all times and cannot be left unattended.
- All dog mess to be bagged up and sealed in your own bags and disposed of in the bins provided to the rear of the hotel.
- Dogs should be on a lead at all times, both within the permitted public areas (Chestnut Lodge, Cedar Lodge, the Terrace Bar and bar terrace area), and any other public areas including outside in the grounds of the hotel and the car parks.
- A maximum of two well-behaved dogs will be accepted in the room.
- Dogs barking or disturbing other residents will be asked to be moved to the resident's car, or to leave the premises.
- Any damage to the bedroom, bathroom, corridor, bar or gardens will be chargeable via the pre-authorised credit card.
- Any strong smells necessitating the putting off of a room for one or more nights will incur a charge equivalent to the lost room revenue for each night.
- Hotel management decisions are final in respect of any issues that may arise from accommodating dogs.
